**PRACTICAL TRAINING: DRAFTING, PLEADING AND CONVEYANCE**

This course will be taught class instructions and simulation exercises, preferably with the assistance of practicing lawyers/ retired judges. Apart from teaching the relevant provisions of law, the course will include not less than 15 exercises in drafting carrying a total of 45 marks (3 marks for each) and 15 exercises in conveyance carrying another 45 marks (3 marks for each exercise) as detailed below:-

(a) Drafting- General Principles of drafting and relevant substantive laws shall be taught.

(b) Pleadings-

1. Civil: Plaint, Written Statement, Interlocutory application, Original Petition, Affidavit, Execution Petition, Memorandum of Appeal and Revision, Petition under Article 226 and 32 of the Constitution of India.
2. Criminal: Complaint, Criminal Miscellaneous Petition, Bail Application, Memorandum of Appeal and Revision.
3. Conveyance: Sale Deed, Mortgage Deed, Lease Deed, Gift Deed, Promissory Note, Power of Attorney, Will, and Trust Deed.
4. Drafting of writ petition and PIL petition.

The remaining 10 marks will be given in a viva-voce which will test the understanding of legal practice in relation to drafting, pleading and conveyance. The viva-voce shall be conducted by a Board of Examiners consisting of one external examiner and one internal examiner to be appointed by the Board of Studies.

**PUBLIC INTEREST LAWYERING, LEGAL AID AND PARA-LEGAL EARVICE**

This paper can be taught partly through class-room instructions including simulation exercises and partly through extension programmes like Lok Adalat, legal aid camps, legal literacy and para-legal training. The course will also contain lessons on negotiations and counseling, use of computer in legal work, legal research in support of Public Interest Litigation, writing of case comments, editing of law journals, and law office management. This part will carry 90 marks that may be appropriately divided to the different programmes.

There will be a viva voce examination conducted by one external and one internal examiner duly appointed by the concerned University. This will carry 10 marks.

This course will be taught through class instructions and simulation exercises, preferably with the assistance of practicing Lawyers/retired judges. Apart from teaching the relevant provisions of Law. The course will include 15 exercises in Drafting carrying a total of 45 marks and 15 exercises in conveyancing carrying another 45 marks (3 marks for each exercise) as detailed below:-

**(A) DRAFTING-** General Principles of drafting and relevant substantive rules shall be taught.

**(B) Pleading-**

- 1) **CIVIL-** (i) Plaint, (ii) Written statement, (iii) Interlocutory application, (iv) original Petition, (v) Execution petition, & (vi) Memorandum of appeal and revision (vii) Petition under article 226 & 32 of the Constitution of India.
- 2) **Criminal-** (i) Complaints, (ii) Criminal miscellaneous petition, (iii) Bail application and (iv) Memorandum of appeal and revision.

**Alternate Dispute Resolution (Practical training)**

**Outline of the course -:**

1. Negotiation skills to be learned with simulated program.
2. Conciliation skills.
3. Arbitration Law and practice including International arbitration and arbitration rules.

The course is required to be conducted by senior legal practitioners through simulation and case studies. Evaluation may also be conducted by practical exercises at least for a significant part of evaluation.



  
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## **PRACTICAL TRAINING: MOOT COURT, PRE-TRIAL PREPARATIONS AND PARTICIPATION IN TRIAL PROCEEDINGS**

This paper will have three components of 30 marks each and a viva-voce for 10 marks.

**(a) Moot court (30 marks)**

Every student will do at least three moot courts in a year with 10 marks for each. The moot court will be assigned problem and it will be evaluated for 5 marks for written submissions and 5 marks for oral advocacy.

**(b) Observation of trial in two cases, one civil and one criminal (30 marks).** Students will attend two trials in the course of the last two or three years of LL. B. studies. They will maintain a record and enter the various steps observed during their attendance on different days in the court assignment. This scheme will carry 30 marks.

**(c) Interviewing techniques and Pre-trial Preparations:** Each student will observe two interviewing sessions of clients at the lawyer's office/ legal aid office and record the proceedings in a diary which will carry 15 marks. Each student will further observe the preparation of documents and court papers by the advocate and the procedure for the filing of the suit/ petition. This will be recorded in the diary which will carry 15 marks.

**(d) The fourth component of this paper will be viva voce examination on all the above three aspect. This will carry 10 marks. The viva voce examination will be conducted by one external examiner and one internal examiner duly appointed by the concerned University.**



  
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
