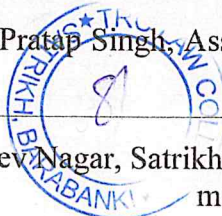

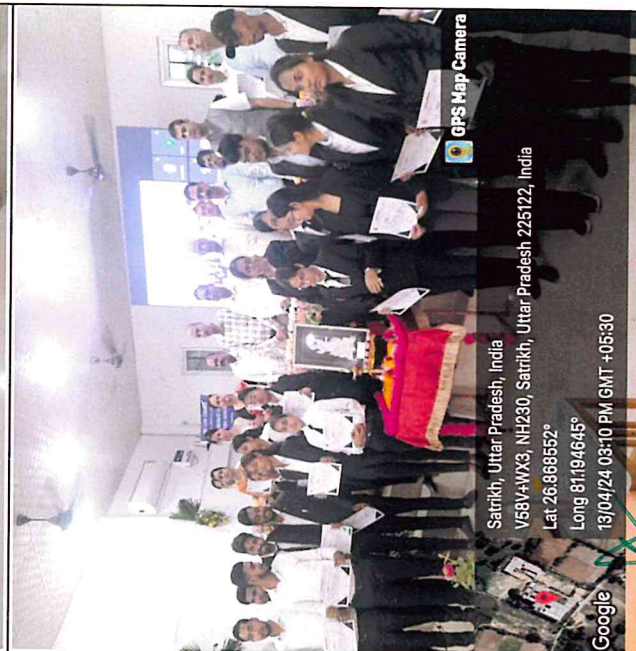
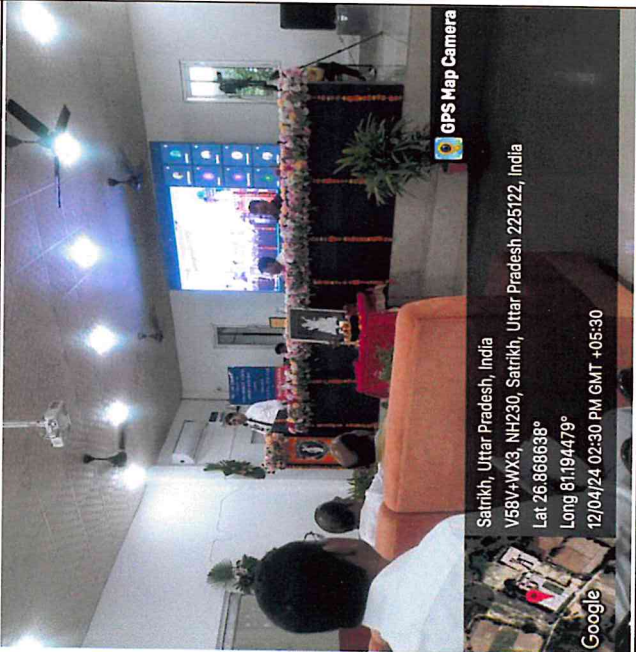

Privacy can be defined as the individual fundamental right which makes one's personal life private. It is one of the rights which have same meaning to the public irrespective of their place of birth, place where they reside, where they belong to or where they work for at general, meaning thereby the concept of privacy and the importance to protect it cannot be changed by changing the nation, religion, work, place etc. The government has the duty to protect the right to privacy of every citizen as well as of an individual of a nation. According to the UN's UDHR, 1948 right to privacy is a part of Human right and is a Fundamental right of an individual. The development of technology specially the Internet and computer gave pace to development of the online trade, commerce, e- transaction etc. which has tremendously raised the issue related to privacy breach, etc.

In order to protect the right to privacy, there were a number of conventions made so that to protect the right of an individual as international as well as domestic level on one hand and to provide more effective mechanism to the legislation on the other hand. There are number of conventions and treaties at international level as well as at regional level such as: UDHR, 1948; International convention on civil and political right; convention on the right of child; European convention for the protection of human right and fundamental freedom; GDPR, American convention on human right; APEC privacy framework and many more. The author in this article proposes to deal with a number of international conventions, treaties as well as regional convention related to right to privacy. The article also proposes to deal with the impact of convention on the domestic legislation as well as the extent to which these convention and treaties is successful in solving the problem related to right to privacy with special reference to the cyberspace.

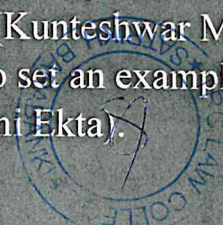

In ancient times this district was part of the kingdom ruled by Suryavanshi kings, whose capital was Ayodhya. As also earlier said, King Dashrath and his famous son, Lord Ram were of this dynasty. The Kulguru of this dynasty was Guru Vashisht who preached and taught the young royal princes of the dynasty at Satrikh, initially known as Saptrishi. Mahadeva Temple, Parijaat Tree, Kintoor (Kunteshwar Mahadev Temple), these all are of Mahabharat Era. The Barabanki city also set an example of secularism at Deva Shareef which is known for Religious Unity (Kaumi Ekta).
