
#### 2.0 LOCATION OF COLLEGE

#### **5.0 GREEN AUDIT**

Green Audit is a process of systematic identification, quantification, recording, reporting and analysis of components of environmental diversity of various establishments. It aims to analyze environmental practices within and outside of the concerned sites, which will have an impact on the eco-friendly ambience. Green audit can be a useful tool for a university to determine how and where they are using the most energy or water or resources; the university can then consider how to implement changes and make savings. It can also be used to determine the type and volume of waste, which can be used for a recycling project or to improve waste minimization plan. It can create health consciousness and promote environmental awareness, values and ethics. It provides staff and students better understanding of green impact on campus. If self-enquiry is a natural and necessary outgrowth of a quality education, it could also be stated that institutional self-enquiry is a natural and necessary outgrowth of a quality educational institution. Thus, it is imperative that the university evaluate its own contributions toward a sustainable future. As environmental sustainability is becoming an increasingly important issue for the nation, the role of higher educational institutions in relation to environmental sustainability is more prevalent. The rapid urbanization and economic development at local, regional and global level has led to several environmental and ecological crises. On this background it becomes essential to adopt the system of the Green Campus for the institutes which will lead for sustainable development and at the same time reduce a sizable amount of atmospheric carbon-di-oxide from the environment. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council, New Delhi (NAAC) has made it mandatory that all Higher Educational Institutions should submit an annual Green Audit Report.

- To suggest the best protocols to add for sustainable development.

#### 8.0 OBJECTIVES

In recent time, the Green Audit of an institution has been becoming a paramount important for self-assessment of the institution which reflects the role of the institution in mitigating the present environmental problems. The university has been putting efforts to keep our environment clean since its inception. But the auditing of this non-scholastic effort of the university has not been documented.

Therefore, the purpose of the present green audit is to identify, quantify, describe and prioritize framework of Environment Sustainability in compliance with the applicable regulations, policies and standards. The main objectives of carrying out Green Audit are:

- To prepare a checklist of flora and fauna diversity in and around the university campus.
- To suggest measures to improve biodiversity within the university campus.
- To monitor the energy consumption pattern of the university.
- To assess the quantity of water usage within the university campus.
- To suggest sustainable energy usage and water conservation practices.
- To find out various sources of organic and solid waste generation and mitigation possibilities.

#### 9.0 METHODOLOGY

The purpose of the audit was to ensure that the practices followed in the campus are in accordance with the Green Policy adopted by the institution. The criteria, methods and recommendations used in the audit were based on the identified risks. The methodology includes: preparation and filling up of questionnaire, physical inspection of the campus, observation and review of the document, interviewing responsible persons and data analysis, measurements and recommendations. The methodology adopted for this audit was a three-step process comprising:

#### 9.1 Pre-Audit Stage

- Plan the audit
- Plan the audit team
- Schedule the audit facility
- Acquire the background information
- Visit the site

#### 9.2 On-Site Stage

- Understand the scope of Audit
- Analyze the strengths and weakness of the internal controls
- Conduct the Audit
- Evaluate the observations of Audit Programs
- Prepare a report of the observations side by side

#### 9.3 Post-Audit

- Produce a draft report of the data collected
- Produce a final report of the final observations and the interference with accuracy
- Distribute the report to the management
- Prepare an action to overcome the flaws
- Keep a watch on the action plan

#### **10.0 COMPONENT OF GREEN AUDIT**

#### 10.1 Water

Water is a natural resource; all living matters depend on water. While freely available in many natural environments, in human settlements potable (drinkable) water is less readily available. We need to use water wisely to ensure that drinkable water is available for all. Aquifer depletion and water contamination are taking place at unprecedented rates. It is therefore essential that any environmentally responsible institution should examine its water use practices. Water auditing is conducted for the evaluation of facilities of raw water intake and determining the facilities for water treatment and reuse. The concerned auditor investigates the relevant method that can be adopted and implemented to balance the demand and supply of water. It is therefore essential that any environmentally responsible institution examine its water use practices.

#### 10.1.1 Source of water

The main source of water in college campus is ground water i.e. bore well. College campus has 03 nos. of bore wells out of which one is fitted with submersible pump and two used as handpump. For storage of fresh water 02 nos. of overhead tanks of capacity 40 KL (Civil) & 01 KL (PVC) provided in the campus. The details of bore well are as under:

The source of the ambient air pollution in the campus is 01 number of DG Set of capacity 30 KVA provided for the alternate electrical energy source as standby. Another source of ambient air pollution in the campus is vehicular emission. DG Set is installed with stack.

#### 10.3 Noise

#### 10.3.1 Source & Management

The source of the ambient noise in the campus area is 01 number of DG Set of capacity 30 KVA provided for the alternate electrical energy source as standby. Another source of

ambient noise of the campus is vehicular traffic of surrounding area. DG Set is installed with acoustic enclosure to reduce the noise.

#### 10.4 Solid Waste

#### 10.4.1 Types of waste

Mainly solid waste including municipal solid waste generated in the campus. However, E-Waste, construction and demolition waste etc. are also generated.

#### 10.4.2 Disposal methods

- 1. For the collection of solid waste, adequate quantity of Dust Bins is provided in each office area and campus area wherever required.
- 2. Presently all the generated waste is disposed through local body.
- 3. When E-waste generates in a certain amount, all the generated e-waste disposed through authorized vendor such as Metro Infotech etc.
- 4. Whenever waste lube oil generated from the DG Set during its servicing, the generated waste oil disposed through authorized recycler.

#### 10.7 Rain Water Harvesting

T.R.C. Law College has implemented the rain water harvesting system to recharge the ground water by constructing 01 number of rain water recharge structure/pit of dimension 08  $\times$  08  $\times$  10 feet.

Recharge pit is connected with the roof top of college building. Pit consists of 01 number of recharging well of 152 mm diameter and desilting chamber. The runoff generated from the roof top of college building diverted to the pit for recharging the ground water.

#### **11.0 SUGGESTIONS / RECOMMENDATIONS**

- It was observed that Management of TRC Law College has implemented the Rain Water Harvesting System by constructing 01 number of rain water recharge structure/pit but there is no display board available. In this regard management is advice to provide a display board (written with rain water recharge structure) near to the rain water recharge structure/pit.
- 2. Management is advice to display the name plate (written with general name and scientific name of tree) over each tree.
- 3. Management s advice to construct the composting pits at appropriate places inside the college campus area in proper manner for the degradation of generated horticulture waste (grass, tree leaves etc.) and covert in to the manure.
- 4. Drinking water dispensing machine and & overhead water storage tank should be mentioned with its cleaning date and next due date of cleaning.





RESOLVED that with respect to existing Centers of Legal Education/ colleges, whose inspection fee has been deposited, application for extension of approval of affiliation is pending, no inspection could be done or the inspection has been done, but inspection report could not be placed before the Legal Education Committee or the Standing Committee for its consideration, such Centers of Legal Education/colleges may continue to admit students only for the academic year 2020-2021. This will apply only in case where affiliation has been granted by the University, which of course, shall be subject to the inspection to be made by the Bar Council of India subsequently"




As per the circular dated 05.02.2020 bearing No.BCI:D:158 (LE:Circulation No.01/2020), issued to all Centers of Legal education, every center of Legal Education /college shall be required to submit a certified authenticated bank statement bearing bank stamp, date and signature, mandatorily with respect to the salary/ies being disbursed to all the teachers/faculties every three months from date of receipt of communication on a regular basis, unless specifically sought at other intervals, and also furnish list of teachers with qualifications as per BCI and UGC Rules, and further furnish proof/receipts of fulfillment of minimum library requirements, as enumerated under Schedule-III, Rule-15, Minimum Library requirements of Legal Education. Certain show cause notices had also been issued specifically to certain Centers of Legal Education/Colleges, with conditions mentioned therein to be complied with. The time for compliance of the circular and the show causes stands extended till 31st October, 2020.

It is made clear that if any Center of Legal Education, fails to submit all the required documents as sought by way of the referred circular and the show cause notices(where applicable), already issued, and the subsequent circular to be issued in this regard, on or before 31st October, 2020, including certified authenticated bank statements, library receipts and faculty list with qualifications then their application for extension of approval for 2021-22 shall not be considered and/or approval already granted may be withdrawn.

You may kindly bear in mind that the Bar Council of India is the sole and supreme sanctioning authority for seats and as a general rule it does not allow any supernumerary quota of seats for law degree courses, over and above the sanctioned strength of seats and whatever reservation of seats is to done by the University as a general rule has to be done within sanctioned strength of seats.

The Center/s of Legal Education/College may take a note of the above mentioned facts and furnish compliance of the same and of the other rules and regulations of Legal Education, including the stipulations specified in the abovesaid referred circular/s, and in Annexure A, attached to this provisional approval of affiliation letter, which is required be complied with by/on/before 31.10.2020 with adequate documentary proof and by way of a notarized affidavit, failing which as stated above their application for extension of approval for 2021-22 shall not be considered and/or approval already granted may be withdrawn.

Since your university has given affiliation for the year 2020-2021, you are requested to allow T.R.C Law College, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh to admit students in three year LL.B as well as five year BA LL.B law courses with existing sections for the academic year 2020-2021.

Note – Kindly ensure to submit English translation of all documents being furnished in Hindi or in any other regional language.

<u>Note</u> – Your University is requested to kindly verify the authenticity of the attached affiliation order submitted by the college and revert back to the Bar Council of India through e-mail as soon as possible.

Note —The inspection fee for LL.B three year and five year regular course is Rs. 3 lacs for each course and for Honours course it is Rs. 5 lacs, while the application fee is Rs. 50,000/- and the refundable guarantee amount (basic amount) is Rs. 5 lacs and if the guarantee amount is not paid immediately after initial grant of approval, you are liable to be levied with an interest or penalty for late deposit of Guarantee Amount.
