

**Amended Ordinance:
LL.M. One Year
Program
Effective From: 2026-27**

Following Amendment is incorporated in existing ordinance of LL.M. One Year Program:

1.	5. Regular Course of Study A. Course of Study: A candidate for the One Year Degree of Master of Laws shall be required to: (i) Study All Four Compulsory paper in First semester. (ii) Study Two Compulsory Papers in the Second Semester and Two Papers including the Dissertation and Viva-Voce Examination with certificate of paper presentation in National/International Seminar and Research Paper Publication in UGC Journal, with the name of supervisor. (iii) Dissertation will be subjected to the approval of Head of the P.G. Department in consultation with the Supervisor.	5. Regular Course of Study A. Course of Study: A candidate for the One Year Degree of Master of Laws shall be required to: I. Study Two Compulsory paper & Select One Optional Group (1. Constitutional Law, 2. Criminal Law) in First semester. In the first semester, students must study two compulsory papers and choose one optional group. Each optional group—either Constitutional Law or Criminal Law—contains three papers, and only one group can be selected. This result in a total of five papers: two compulsory and three from the chosen optional group. II. Study Two Compulsory Papers in the Second Semester and Two Papers including the Dissertation and Viva-Voce Examination. III. Dissertation will be subjected to the approval of Head of the P.G. Department in consultation with the Supervisor.
2.	6. Examination A. General: (i) There shall be a College examination at the end of the First and Second Semester and the candidate for the One Year Degree of Master of Laws shall be required to pass in all the prescribed courses within a maximum period of two years from the year of his being admitted to the First Semester. (ii) Subject to the provisions of these Ordinances, the College Examination for the One Year Degree of Master of Laws shall be held in T.R.C. Law College, Barabanki at such time and on the dates as the Academic Council may prescribe. (iii) (a) A candidate shall be examined in Six (06) written papers, each paper carrying one	6. Examination A. General: (i) There shall be a College examination at the end of the First and Second Semester and the candidate for the One Year Degree of Master of Laws shall be required to pass in all the prescribed courses within a maximum period of two years from the year of his being admitted to the First Semester. (ii) Subject to the provisions of these Ordinances, the College Examination for the One Year Degree of Master of Laws shall be held in T.R.C. Law College, Barabanki at such time and on the dates as the Academic Council may prescribe. (iii) (a) A candidate shall be examined in Seven (07) written papers, each paper

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	hundred marks and covering prescribed courses of study. (b) Examination shall be conducted by means of written papers, each carrying 70 marks and of three hours duration. (c) In each paper 30 marks shall be reserved for award on the basis of performance in the class room. (d) Dissertation shall carry 100 marks. (e) The Viva-Voce Examination shall carry 50 marks and shall be held as soon after the second Semester Examination. (f) The Candidate shall produce Certificate of Paper Presentation of a National/International Seminar and Research Paper Publication in UGC Journal in an academic year with supervisor to the Head of the P.G. Department. It shall carry 50 marks.	carrying one hundred marks and covering prescribed courses of study. (b) Examination shall be conducted by means of written papers, each carrying 70 marks and of three hours duration. (c) In each paper 30 marks shall be reserved for award on the basis of performance in the class room. These marks are divided equally into three categories: Assignment, Presentation, and Mid-Semester Examination, with 10 marks allotted to each respectively. (d) Dissertation shall carry 200 marks: (1) Candidate shall be required to submit the Dissertation at least two weeks before the commencement of Second Semester Examination. (2) The dissertation must include a plagiarism check certificate maximum allowed up to 15 (Fifteen) percent, duly signed by both the Head of the P.G. Department and the Supervisor. (3) The candidate shall be required to secure at least 50% marks in the Dissertation to pass the Examination. (4) The Examiner shall either- (i) Award at least 50% marks, or (ii) Return the Dissertation for revision, or (iii) Reject the Dissertation. (4) The candidate who's Dissertation is returned for revision may revise the dissertation and re-submit it within a period of two months. Failure to submit in time shall result in a declaration that the candidate has failed at the relevant LL.M. Examination. (5) A Dissertation can be revised only once. If the candidate fails to secure pass marks in the revised Dissertation he shall be declared failed in the LL.M. Examination. (6) A Dissertation shall be examined by a Board of two examiners at least one of them shall necessarily be an external examiner. (7) The evaluation of the two examiners
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		shall be coordinated as here under: (i) Each examiner shall award marks out of 100. (8) If the marks awarded by two examiners vary by 20 marks or more then in such case the average marks will be awarded, The decision of the Principal shall be final, in case of any controversy. (9) If one of the examiners return the Dissertation for revision or rejects the Dissertation, his decision shall prevail provided that if one of the examiners has rejected the Dissertation and another examiner has returned it for revision, the Dissertation shall be deemed to be rejected. (10) The Student shall submit the dissertation in Five (05) Hardbound Copies. (e) The Viva-Voce Examination shall carry 100 marks and shall be held as soon after the Second Semester Theory Examination. (f) This Section repealed.
3.	6. Examination F. (ii) Written Paper: A candidate for the LL.M. One Year Degree Examination shall be examined in Six (06) papers as mentioned in Schedule A. (iv) Viva Voce Examination: (a) The Viva Voce Examination shall be conducted by a Board of Examiners. (b) The Board shall consist of three members; at least one of them shall be an external member. (c) The Viva-Voce Examination shall carry 50 marks. (d) The candidate shall be required to obtain a minimum of 50 marks to pass the Viva Voce Examination. (v) Seminar: The Candidate shall have to present a Certificate of Paper Presentation of National/International Seminar in an academic Year and must produce Research Paper published in UGC Journal with Supervisor to the Head of the P.G. Department. It shall carry 50 marks.	6. Examination F. (ii) Written Paper: A candidate for the LL.M. One Year Degree Examination shall be examined in Seven (07) papers as mentioned in revised Schedule A. (iv) Viva Voce Examination: (a) The Viva Voce Examination shall be conducted by a Board of Examiners. (b) The Board shall consist of three members; at least one of them shall be an external member. (c) The Viva-Voce Examination shall carry 100 marks. (d) The candidate shall be required to obtain a minimum of 50 marks to pass the Viva Voce Examination. (v) Seminar: This section repealed.

Examination: H: Scale of Marks, Divisions and Distinction: Maximum Marks in each Paper: 100 Minimum Pass Marks in- (i) Written Papers and Class-room performance: 50% in each paper; (ii) Dissertation: 50% in the aggregate; (iii) Viva Voce: 50% (iv) Seminar: 50% First Division: 65% and above of the aggregate of marks. Second Division: 50% and above of the aggregate marks. Distinction: A student who secures an average of 75% or more marks in the aggregate shall be declared to have obtained distinction. Merit: The Order of Merit shall be determined on the basis of aggregate marks obtained in the prescribed course of study for the LL.M. Degree Examination by the candidates, irrespective of their optional who passed in first attempt within a period of one year from the year of their being admitted to the First Semester.	6. Examination: H: Scale of Marks, Divisions and Distinction: Maximum Marks in each Paper: 100 Minimum Pass Marks in- (i) Written Papers and Class-room performance: 50% in each paper; (ii) Dissertation: 50% in the aggregate; (iii) Viva Voce: 50% (iv) Seminar: This section repealed. Distinction: A student who secures an average of 75% or more marks in the aggregate shall be declared to have obtained distinction. Degree Examination by the candidates, irrespective of their optional who passed in first attempt within a period of one year from the year of their being admitted to the First Semester.
